3.2. Contamination & Counterfeit Ingredients

A 2023 study published in *Drug Safety* examined 68 “black-market” opioid samples purchased online. Findings included:

- 31 % contained fentanyl or fentanyl analogues — substances up to 100 times more potent than Tramadol.
- 22 % were adulterated with synthetic cannabinoids or benzodiazepines, raising the risk of synergistic sedation.
- 15 % were placebo tablets with no active ingredient, leaving patients without pain relief and sometimes leading to dangerous self-medication attempts.

- FDA’s “Operation PharmEasy” – A 2024 crackdown that seized over 1 million illicit opioid tablets from U.S. mail streams.
- World Health Organization (WHO) Guidance – Publishes a global risk-assessment framework for opioid procurement, emphasizing the importance of robust supply-chain verification.
