

# Order Xanax XR 1mg Online Secure Telehealth Now

**Red Flags to Report Immediately**

- Unexplained drowsiness or difficulty breathing.
- Craving the medication or feeling unable to stop after a dose.
- Combining Xanax XR with alcohol, opioids, or other sedatives.
- Mood swings, agitation, or thoughts of self-harm.

If any of these arise, the patient should contact their prescriber or seek emergency care. Early intervention can prevent complications like respiratory depression, overdose, or severe withdrawal.
